First reading: The letter of St. Paul to the Romans (Rom 5:1-2,5-8)

Second reading: Gospel according to John (4:5-15,19b-26,39a,40-42)

one single Kingdom to lead all His Creation to God.

In "Le Royaume" of June 1983 [no. 12, p. 5], *Marie-Paule wrote:*

All our faults and imperfections are defilements of our soul, hence the absolute necessity of interior reform, of conversion...

Authentic love quickly transforms a life.

For converting means changing our conduct or the path being followed; it is turning away from what is evil to turn to God. It is a new direction being given to all our behavior.
